



Phillips Farm

The Phillips family had long dreamed of preserving its New Hartford, Connecticut farm for future generations to enjoy. Once a dairy farm, the land today is used for hay production and contributes significantly to the community's farming character.

In 2009, The Phillips Family and The Town of New Hartford, in partnership with the State of Connecticut and The Trust for Public Land, agreed on a conservation easement for the permanent protection of 59-acres.

High meadows with Eastern views, large wetlands with active beaver and bird life.

The land connects to a 300-acre greenway stretching from the Goula Open Space Area to Antolini School, protecting important natural resources and wildlife habitat. It supports a large, pristine wetlands and tributaries that feed into the Nepaug Reservoir.
