## **Trash Compactors: What goes in them:**

#### Kitchen food prep waste ONLY!

- Items from food waste from daily food prep (but preferably use compost)
- Plastic bags from grocery or other stores (or reuse or take back to the store where they came)
- · Meat Styrofoam trays from the grocer
- Black Plastic
- · Plastic that had chemicals in it
- Disposable beverage cups (plastic, Styrofoam, paper, cardboard)
- Disposable straws (paper and plastic)
- Disposable silverware and used paper towels / napkins
- Broken or chipped ceramic or glass plate or cup, however, if you have a large amount you must go to the scale and pay for disposal.
- A small (2' x 4") rug that goes in front of your sink can go in here but anything larger MUST go on the scale.
- Styrofoam from television and other electronics packaging may go in the trash compactor but large pieces like boat docks must go on the scale.

# Items NOT recyclable: (place in trash)

- Black Plastic
- Paper plates, napkins, tissues, and paper towels
- Plastic silverware and straws
- Plastic bags (return to store)
- Plastic containers that contained chemicals
- Glass drinking cups.
- Shredded Paper
- Small Styrofoam, cut-up paper, plastic beverage cups
- Pizza boxes with grease go in trash not recycling
- Broken ceramic or other broken glass dishware

# ITEMS <u>NOT</u> FOR TRASH COMPACTOR

GO TO THE SCALE ON TOP OF HILL!

Absolutely NO: Carpets, construction or renovation debris, furniture, household clean-outs, large sheets of plastic or large shipping plastic bags, tarps of any size, water hoses, large Styrofoam.

#### Recycling is Mandatory in CT, It's the Law

Law: Pursuant to CT General Statutes sec. 22a-220(f), 22a-229, 22a-241b. Failure to recycle may be subject to fines and potential civil enforcement action.

# What can I place in single stream recycling? ALL FOOD MUST BE RINSED OUT!

- Bottles (from food products and beverages)
- Cans (from food or beverages)
- Cartons (from food or beverages)
- Junk Mail
- Magazines/ Catalogs
- Newspaper (full sheets)
   If it's cut up throw it into the trash.
- Office Paper (white or colored) full sheets
   If it's cut up throw it in the trash.
- Plastic (from food cartons, detergents, or beverages)
- Tin foil trays and sheets

# Other Items recycled, in separate locations—ASK FIRST Note: WE accept recyclable items from residences ONLY NOT businesses or schools.

- Batteries (auto, household, hearing aids)
- Brush / leaves / wood (no stumps)
- Clothing (place in bags)
- Electronics and Televisions
- Motor oil and anti-freeze (separate)
- Light bulbs (maximum 6 per week)
- Metal
- Mattress / Box Spring (max 4 per week)
- Paint (oil and latex, no spray cans) max 10 per week
- Propane tanks **20# ONLY** max 6 per week
- Tag Sale (ASK ATTENDANT- new or gently used)
- Cardboard
- Tires (cost per tire)
- Wire
- No hot ashes in household trash

Residents within the District may continue to use RRDD1 on Wednesday evenings without a sticker to drop off certain recyclables without a sticker.

# Composting at home: What can I compost:

- Fruits and vegetable
- Eggshells
- Coffee grounds and filters
- Tea Bags
- Nut Shells
- Shredded Newspaper
- Cardboard / Paper
- Yard Trimmings / Leaves
- Houseplants
- Hay and straw
- Sawdust and Wood Chips
- Cotton & Wool Rags
- Hair and Fur
- Fireplace ashes

#### What NOT to compost:

- Dairy products (butter, milk, sour cream, yogurt, eggs)
- Fats, grease, lard, oils
- Meat, fish bones, meat scraps
- Yard trimmings with chemical pesticides

#### Composting at home:

Select a dry shady spot near a water source for your compost bin. Add brown and green materials as they are collected and moisten them, mix in grass clippings, and green waste often, then bury fruit and vegetable waste under 10 inches of compost material. Optional: You can cover the top of the compost with a tarp to keep it moist. When the material at the bottom is dark and rich in color, your compost is ready to use. This could take anywhere between two months to two years.

### The Principles of the five R's:

- **Refuse** to buy it if you do not need it. Do not take the "freebie" if you are not going to use it.
- Reduce what you buy or purchase in quantity to limit excess packaging
- **Reuse** instead of purchasing single use items, such as water bottles and metal straws.
- Repurpose something old making a new item.
- Recycle bottles, cans, cardboard, and newspapers.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Many towns throughout CT have residential weekly pick up included in their taxes. RRDD1 towns DO NOT. Residents have two choices:

- 1.) Purchase a sticker, drop off trash during open hours or
- 2.) Hire a private hauler to come to your residence weekly (more expensive)

#### **RRDD1 HOURS:**

- Monday: 7:00 AM 3:00 PM
- Wednesday: 7:00 AM 3:00 PM and
   Wednesday: 4:00 PM 7:00 PM (lower level only)
- Friday: 7:00 AM 3:00 PM
  Saturday: 7:00 AM 3:00 PM

#### STICKERS:

- Available at the gatehouse during regular daytime hours. (7:00 AM- 3:00 PM)
- Vehicle MUST be on site to pick up sticker, employee to affix sticker to lower left windshield
- NO sticker swapping or sharing, one per household although a second vehicle pass may be purchased for only \$10- MUST be same address, same apartment (proof needed)
- Failure to follow posted rules and regulations may lead to penalties / fines/ and / or loss of sticker.
- Note: Sticker includes, at no extra fee, the disposal of YOUR kitchen trash can waste disposed of in the lower-level trash compactors. Recyclables MUST be removed, per law and placed in the appropriate recycling containers on site. All other "debris," such as construction, carpeting, furniture, remodeling and clean outs MUST be driven to the upper lot scale area, additional fees apply. Sticker holders are NOT permitted to bring in household trash from other households. Landlords must get a full sticker for each tenant, no sticker swapping. Trash with recyclables NOT separated will be required to pay for disposal at the scale. We have the right to open bags and inspect.

A Day Pass is available for \$20 per day plus debris fee. Resident must report to scale area on the upper level. Additional MSW and or landfill fees apply.

#### Items NOT Accepted at RRDD1

- Asbestos
- Boats / campers / pop-ups
- o Chemicals
- Explosives / Fireworks
- Fire Extinguishers
- Hazardous waste materials of any nature
- Household cleaners
- Insecticides / Herbicides / Pesticides
- Lead based paints.
- Medical or Pathological waste
- Mercury thermometers
- Oil filters
- Paint thinners
- PCB's, marine paint, resins, street paint
- Propane tanks (other than 20-pound units)
- Radioactive, Radon
- Smoke detectors
- o Gas, electronic cigarettes
- Weed killers / strippers.

### **Household Hazardous Waste Day**

We are in the process of planning this event, tentatively planned at Torrington Water Pollution Control Facility off Bogue Road, Torrington, Saturday, October 28, 2023 from 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM. This event is of no charge to the resident BUT a large expense to RRDD1! Plan accordingly when you purchase chemicals. **Don't overbuy!** Give away what you do not need before throwing it away.

Surveillance cameras are in use throughout the property for several reasons. If you are unsure of where something goes, ASK! DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS HERE that do not belong here. DO NOT try to hide them in your trash! This can be dangerous and even fatal.


